Light A Candle on Our “Burning Bush” Today!

Lighted candles have been part of sacred events and gatherings, expressing something of the glory of God and our joy in His service. In a place hallowed by the devotion of generations, like Saint Miriam, we offer you these candles to light – candles to accompany your prayer, candles to go on burning when your own prayers may be inexpressible in words, candles lit as a sign of your heart’s concerns or joys moved into light of divine love in the realm of God. Even as you leave, your candle will go on burning as a testament to your openness to the sacred illuminating the path for others to be drawn to God.

A light tells of Christ, the Light of the World, and the flame of whose love burns in our hearts causing us to shine for Him in the dark places of human life. One candle can give light to another without ceasing itself to burn. The light, which Christ has kindled in us, burns all the brighter for being offered to others.

The candle flame burning bright and steady symbolizes prayer – prayer going straight to God who loves to hear and accept it – prayer brings Christ’s light into our lives and the lives of those we meet.

Perhaps when you light your candle, you have time only for a brief prayer, but your candle outlasts it, expressing your desire constantly to lift up your heart to God. May this moment you share with God remind you that it is out of love you were created, and it is love that re-creates us. It is out of love for the world Jesus continues to live in us and therefore can say to each and every one of us, “You are the light of the world”.
